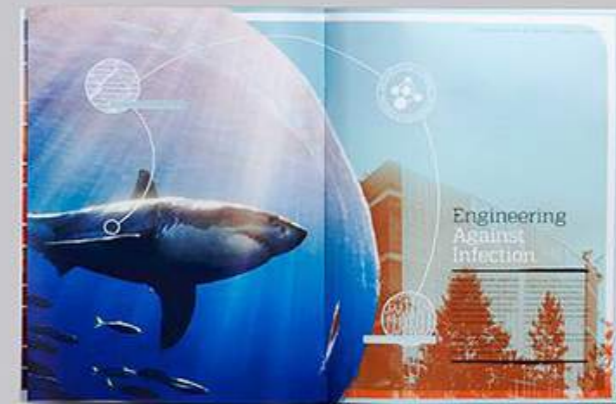
SOLVING THE **SMALL** PROBLEMS TAKES

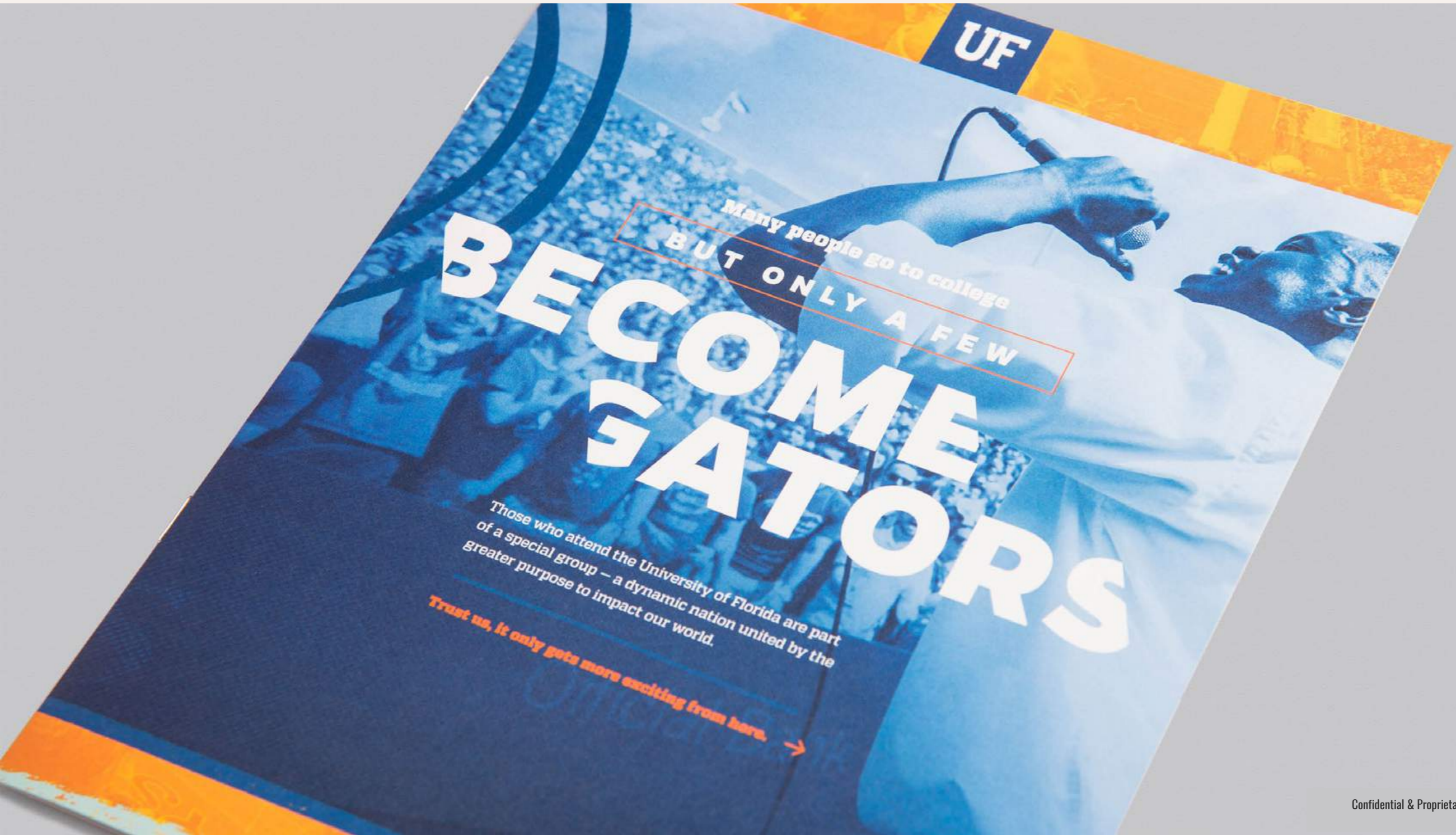
Everything We've Got.
